**6N SYSTEMS, INC. TO JOIN HEALTHCARE INDUSTRY LEADERS AT U.S. SENATE
TO DEMONSTRATE
INNOVATIVE HEALTHCARE TECHNOLOGY**

***Demonstration to Senate and Staffers to promote legislation for Bill S. 908 –
The Consortium on the Impact of Technology in Aging Health Services***

GANSEVOORT, NY – 76 million baby boomers are poised to challenge the very concept of growing old in America and our capacity to provide essential health and wellness services to them. There is now a national push to create technologies that will help streamline healthcare and improve the lives of seniors.

The Center for Aging Services Technologies (CAST) has selected 6N Systems, Inc., a long-term care software company based in New York State’s Tech Valley region, to participate in a technology demonstration at the U.S. Senate. This demonstration is in support of legislation to promote the research, production and adoption of new technologies to improve how the health care system serves seniors and their health care networks. 6N Systems, Inc. will demonstrate its 6N EMR™ (Electronic Medical Record) software product – including a full suite of clinical tools such as electronic doctors’ orders, resident charts, custom assessments and reporting that assist long term care organizations with streamlining data management to measure outcomes, identify problem areas, and help providers take concrete steps to improve quality of care.

6N Systems will demonstrate its software to senators and staffers along with other healthcare technology vendors, including Philips Lifeline Systems, GE Healthcare and Honeywell. 6N Systems’ EMR™ software is an integral part of a resident’s larger health care network, by providing clinicians and physicians at long term care organizations with the information they need at point of care to help with improved safety, quality of care, and efficiency. This data is not only to be used for direct care, but also becomes part of the larger cycle of care delivery, evaluation and innovation. For example, in 2006 the Institute of Medicine (IOM) reported that at least 1.5 million Americans are sickened, injured or killed by medication errors. By using 6N’s EMR with integrated ordering, the doctor can automatically check patient medical histories, potential drug interactions and allergies, and duplicative or conflicting therapies, before writing a new prescription.

“We are very excited to have this opportunity to showcase how our technology can not only improve the quality of care for residents, but can also drastically improve the efficiency of providing that high quality care,” said Bill Kilburn, CTO of 6N Systems. “We appreciate the opportunity from CAST to help communicate the importance and value of technology in improving health care management.”

The software platform is built with the flexibility to enable interoperability in the future, to help the software “talk” to other software products – such as hospital or physician practice systems – a goal of

many vendors in the EMR space. Most healthcare technology companies are working towards promoting a unified Electronic Health Record that can be accessed by a patient and all of a patient's health care providers.

The purpose of Bill S. 908 – The Consortium on the Impact of Technology in Aging Health Services, is to create a Consortium to evaluate and advance the potential of new technologies to help the U.S. prepare for the unprecedented growth of older adults and the impact this demographic shift will have on the nation's health care system. The Consortium – a public-private partnership – will serve as a catalyst for advancements in technology to ensure quality care with greater cost efficiencies, and position U.S. companies to be highly competitive in the expected global market for aging related services that is estimated to be well over 100 billion dollars annually.

The Consortium will be composed of 17 highly regarded researchers, business and government executives, and consumers. The Chairperson shall be appointed by the President; all other members shall be appointed by Congress. The original Senate co-sponsors of the Bill are: Senator Norm Coleman (R-MN), Senator Jack Reed (D-RI), Senator Herb Kohl (D-WI), Senator Mel Martinez (R-FL), and Senator Gordon Smith (R-OR).

The demonstration will take place Jan. 30, 2008, from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. in room G-50 of the Dirksen Senate Building in Washington, D.C.
